8. In order to develop good homiletical techniques, the preacher must first understand thoroughly the Scripture passage upon which the sermon is based.

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9. The text to be studied for the basis of a sermon should be a complete thematic segment usually a whole paragraph or more in length. This is called a "Pericope".

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10. The passage chosen should be within the abilities of the preacher to research, arrange, and present.

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11. The length/depth of the text should be considered in view of the preaching occasion.

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12. A text should be avoided simply because it is familiar to many in the audience.

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13. Biblical, historical, literary, and theological contexts are not necessary in the proper structuring of a sermon.

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14. Homiletics or preaching, the goal of the both should be the latter.

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15. In our study of methods of preaching, we learned that if the sermon is based on a passage that is one or two verses, the sermon is considered textual.

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16. Although not necessary, most scholars agree that a good sermon has at least 3 main points.

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17. After a preacher has developed her main points, it is a good idea to develop the subpoints of a sermon using one of the "Textual Methods".

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18. It is always important for a preacher to give their sermons a title.

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19. In sermon preparation, it is usual to think in terms of subject, theme, and proposition.

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20. Although many preachers are not proficient in foreign languages, an attempt should be made to translate from the original language whenever possible.

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
